


Update on The Rev Dr. Kerry Knox Westerwick, Pastor of FPC from 2010 to 2015

Kerry has had some turmoil in her life in the last couple of years: In February 2021, she was diagnosed with lung cancer and subsequently had one lung completely removed. In July 2021, her husband, Barry, was found on their front porch in Florida – suddenly deceased. Early in 2022, Kerry's cancer had returned to her remaining lung and metastasized to other organs. On 12 23 2022, I received a note from Kerry saying that she is now receiving in-home hospice care with a prognosis of maybe 6 months before the end. She confided that she does not think it will be that long. Kerry said she is too weak to engage in telephone conversations, but she does welcome texting and written notes.
