

First Lesson Matthew 3: 16-17

From July 4 to 5, heavy rainfall resulted in catastrophic flash flooding in the Hill Country area in central Texas. Concerns remain for additional heavy rains and flooding from Hill Country to North Texas. The sudden floods resulted in more than 100 lives lost, and search and rescue is ongoing.
